



The school will:

Ensure every child matters by:

- Providing a happy, caring and secure learning environment.
- Striving to meet and exceed the needs of all the children, by offering a broad and balanced curriculum delivered in an engaging and creative way.
- Encouraging children to reach their full potential through maximum attendance.
- Working with parents to resolve any issues affecting their child's work or behaviour and keeping them informed of their progress.
- Promoting a healthy lifestyle encouraging walking to school and healthy eating, drinking water and daily physical exercise.
- Providing regular opportunities for outdoor learning, through forest schools, trips and through curriculum subjects.
- Providing clear information about your child's learning each week and about the home learning required.
- The governing body takes an active role in the life of the school, supporting staff, parents and children.

Parents/Carers will be expected to:

- Support children's learning at home, including reading at home at least 3 times a week.
- Be punctual in bringing children to school and collecting them at the end of the day and inform the school of a child's absence by telephone by 9.30am on each day of absence.
- Attend parent's evenings and meetings, to discuss the child's progress and to gain more information about new teaching methods and changes in the curriculum. Work with the class teacher when children's needs are over and above class routines and activities.
- Be realistic about their children's abilities and offer encouragement and praise.
- Keep school informed of anything, however small, which may affect your child's learning.
- Encourage a healthy lifestyle by walking, cycling or scooting to school, where possible.
- Check their child's hair regularly to prevent the spread of headlice and to keep long hair tied back. Treat outbreaks quickly to ensure this does not spread.
- Children have no jewellery except for stud earrings, no make-up or heeled shoes.
- Actively support the essential fundraising work of our Parent Teacher Association (PTA).
- Ensure that PE kits, book bags and coats are available in school daily.
- Assist in upholding our high standards for behaviour and uniform.
- Read all correspondence from the school, including the weekly newsletter.

The children will:

- Keep the School Rule......Always try your best!
- Be kind and helpful to others.
- Play kindly and use the playground sensibly.

- Help to keep the school clean and tidy by putting things back where they belong and look after school property.
- Set good examples to others.
- Wear the school uniform and take pride in their appearance as a member of our school.
- Tell a member of staff if they feel worried, upset or are feeling ill.
